

The AICE Diploma

The AICE (Advanced International Certificate of Education) is also known as the Cambridge AICE Diploma. It was developed by Cambridge Assessment.

To quote from their website:

The Cambridge AICE Diploma is made up of individual Cambridge International AS & A Levels.[...] By demanding knowledge from three different subject groups, plus the core compulsory subject, Cambridge International AS Level Global Perspectives & Research, the Cambridge AICE Diploma provides a broad curriculum with a balance of maths and science, languages, arts and humanities, and interdisciplinary subjects. It maintains flexibility and choice by allowing students to choose subjects at different levels. [...]

There are over 50 Cambridge International AS and A Level subjects to choose from across four subject groups:

Group 1: Mathematics and Sciences

Group 2: Languages

Group 3: Arts and Humanities

Group 4: Interdisciplinary subjects (optional)"

Students have the option to study one year to AS Level or two years to A Level. It is possible for students to take individual subjects (at AS or A Level, depending on the credit value) alongside other qualifications; not all students will complete the full diploma. The individual subjects taken can be considered independently at their respective level, alongside other qualifications presented in an application. For example, a student could take two APs alongside a two-credit/A Level AICE subject.
